Last year, Riverside Youth Judo hosted the 2015 "Yuuki no Shiai" or "Contest of Courage", a sanctioned Judo Scrimmage created specifically for Special Developing Judo Players diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder, Cerebral Palsy, Downs Syndrome, and Intellectual Disability Disorder. The results were tremendous as Special Developing players progressed in Judo. The collaboration between the Riverside Youth Judo Club, Riverside Police Foundation, and Riverside Police Officers' Association resulted in allowing 30 Special Developing Judoka to compete in the scrimmage.



In response to the popular event, the 2016 Yuuki no Shiai will be held at Orange Terrace Community Center. The 2016 "Contest of Courage" is expected to host at least 100 Special Developing Judo Competitors! Each competitor will have an opportunity to compete at their own level and ability. Volunteer judoka will be on hand to help each contestant compete. Judo Trophies will be provided for all competitors.



Athletes may participate in the "Contest of Courage" for free. All athletes are welcomed to enjoy complimentary food and beverage at the event.
